During our 20th anniversary year, we made great changes as well as great strides. Not only do we have a new look and logo, we also have a new energy. We see that when we look at our numbers.

This year, we surpassed the million dollar mark in our grantmaking. Our work touched more people than ever: We added more than 1,000 new donors to our rolls, tripled our email constituency and hosted more than 75 events that brought together nearly 6,000 people. We have brought a new direction to the Foundation's work this year: advocacy. We know that while it is important to provide services to women and girls, if we do not advocate on their behalf and teach them how to advocate for themselves, their long-term health, safety and security are in jeopardy.

We want you to be informed and engaged on the issues. We find few people who look at issues and budgets through a gender lens, and we know that is crucial work if we are to have policies and programs in place that will benefit women and girls. So, we sent you action and information alerts about the federal, state and local budgets, judicial appointments, sex education, emergency contraception, human trafficking, family leave insurance and women's access to health services and information.

We appreciate all your support, and we hope we can continue to count on it to keep this vital work going in the years to come.

As we all know, when you invest in women, you invest in the community and its future.

## 20<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY GRANTS

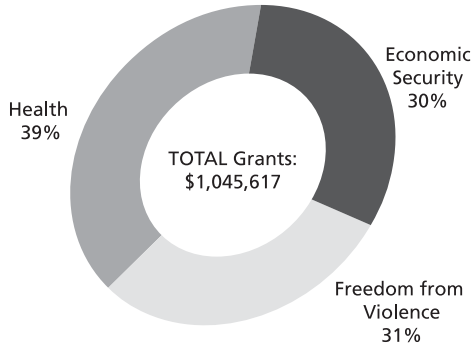

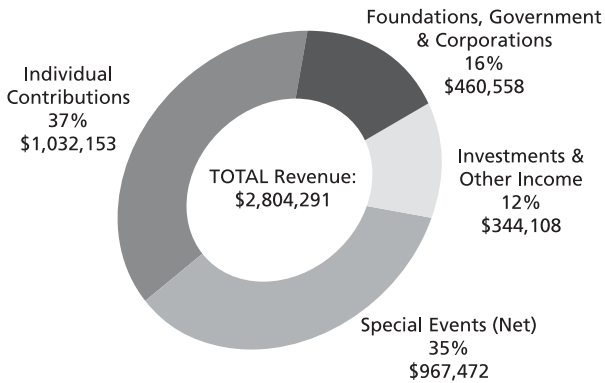

## Fiscal Year July 1, 2005 – June 30, 2006

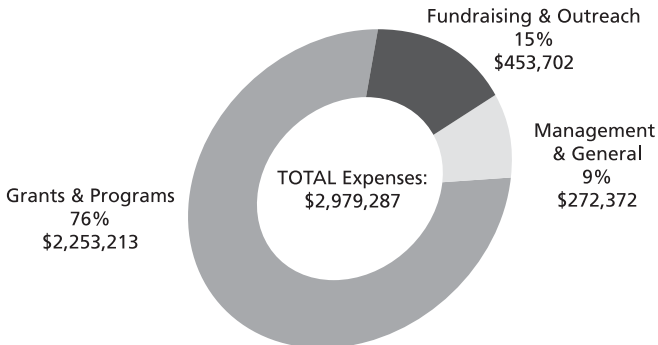
### GRANTS BY PROGRAM AREA
